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## A. GENERAL COURSE OBJECTIVES

The student will develop multiple strategies to learn Spanish as their second language to an elementary level.

They will make the most of the advantages of being in Seville to interact with the locals and to learn specific vocabulary in suitable situations.

## B. SPECIFIC COURSE OBJECTIVES

Taking as a base the levels A1-A2 from the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages, the pupil at the end of the semester, should have achieved the following objectives for the different language skills.

Listening Comprehension: ability to understand phrases and vocabulary about daily life (house, family, food, bars...), simple messages, and warnings, and the main ideas of a present tense discussion, when the pronunciation is clear, and is about familiar topics.

Reading Comprehension: ability to understand simple texts in the present tense, as well as basic information in shops, restaurants, posters, and adverts.

Oral Interaction: ability to say hello, and goodbye, to present oneself, and participate in simple talks about known topics. Interact in shops and restaurants.

Oral Expression: ability to talk about simple topics in the present tense about daily life (nationality, family, professions)

Written Expression: ability to write in the present tense messages, simple texts, letters, postcards, etc.

## -Examinations and quizzes

The aim of the examinations and written tests is to evaluate comprehension and assimilation of necessary theoretic and practical content in order to reach the specifically marked objectives of this course, in agreement with parameters identified by the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages.

In general, the 3 examinations and 2 quizzes will include a series of written activities about grammatical, functional, lexical, and cultural aspects studied in class. One of these questions will serve to evaluate the written comprehension and expression of the student. The student should write an essay, in which they express their opinion


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and knowledge about some of the content studied in class. This exercise will be worth more than the rest of the questions.

## -Compositions

The students will personally hand in 4 compositions, all double spaced, typed (200-250 words).

They will number the pages and in the top right hand corner of the first page the student will right their first name and surname. The nomenclature of the file will be: Course Code followed by the type of document (composition " $C$ ", followed by the number of the corresponding composition or assignment and date day, month, year). Example: Span 1020- C1-10-11-15.

For your assessment, you will have to take the content, presentation, use of grammar, and style into account ( $15 \%$ of the final grade).

1. My Autobiography
2. My daily routine in Seville
3. My favourite memory in the past
4. My experience in Spain

## -Oral Presentation

Each student will do an Oral Presentation in Spanish and will be able to do it about whatever interest the student.

The student will make use of any material that makes the exposition clear and intelligent. You will not be able to read directly from the text. However, you will be able to use annotations or cards that help you to remember the content of your presentation, as well as write some vocabulary on the board, so that the other students can understand your presentation better.

- Originality of the presentation 10\%
- Content 20\%
- Oral Expression, vocabulary, clarity of ideas, grammar. 70\%

Duration is approx 10 minutes.

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## -Homework and Participation

The student will have homework assigned by the professor and it will be corrected the next day in class.
