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## A. COURSE OBJECTIVE

## A1. GENERAL COURSE OBJECTIVE

Students will improve their oral and written communication to be able to confidently and fluently express likes, preferences, thoughts and opinions.

## A2. SPECIFIC COURSE OBJECTIVES

Students are able to interact in a variety of situations and also know how to deal with everyday problems. Students learn to:

- Understand the main ideas of debates in Standard Spanish. Ask and give personal opinions in an informal conversation. Take initiative, file complaints, ask for clarification, give instructions as how to do something, summarize and respond to questions.

Throughout the course students will acquire a communicative competency according to their level, in writing as well as orally in order to:

- Participate in conversations about family matters, work and travel.
- Write messages and short tests expressing experiences, narrating stories, summarizing a book or film.
- Understand texts that contain basic information such as adverts, menus, timetables etc.

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## C. CLASS RULES

## E. COMPOSITIONS AND ORAL PRESENTATIONS

To calculate the final grade the professor will apply the following guidelines:

## $\checkmark$ Compositions

Students will write three compositions throughout each course sequence. The content (information, originality and depth) will be taken into account as well as written expression (agreement, conjugation, vocabulary, logical sentence order) and presentation. The composition grade will be lowered if students have written below the number of words required.

## Intercambio composition topics

Students must personally hand in three compositions to the professor. Each composition must be 250-300 words long, typed in Arial Font size 12 and doubled spaced.

1. My favorite movie
2. Ecology in America
3. American Universities

## $\checkmark$ Homework and Participation

The student will have to work on the assigned tasks by the professor at home as the following day they will be corrected in class.

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## $\checkmark$ Oral Presentation

Each student will work on one of the topics proposed by the professor; each student will do a presentation in Spanish to the rest of the class. The student may use any material that makes the presentation clear

Students may not read directly from a text; however they may use index cards or notes which help them remember the content of the presentation.

As in the case of the compositions, the content, oral expression, pronunciation, vocabulary, clarity of ideas and grammar will all be evaluated positively.

The presentation will be approximately 5-10 minutes long.

## Oral presentation topics

Comment on a current Spanish news announcement which has interested you for some reason. You must present it and give your personal opinion about it.
