#### **A. COURSE DESCRIPTION:**

This course is a general introduction to the history of Spain from its early beginnings to our days. A special attention will be given to Andalucía, and the importance of Sevilla, linking its past with what can be seen around the city.

This course provides the student a first-hand experience with a historical time period that clearly marked the history and society of Andalucía. Class sessions, together with readings, activities, discussions, student presentations, field trips, watching documentaries, and viewing some pictures, is how the students will learn about the history of Spain.

#### **B. REQUIREMENTS:**

For a successful completion of this course it is fundamental a regular attendance, preparation for possible class discussions, completion of possible assigned reading, and mainly passing grades on examinations.

There is no textbook for this course. Your instructor will give copies and handouts to you. The student will use a course pack including class notes. **The pack is available in our library.**

Students have access to the public library services in Sevilla, especially the Infanta Elena library located in the Avd. Maria Luisa s/n, and the central library of the University of Sevilla in C/ San Fernando n°4.
